FCC's Investment and Endowment funds were created to help offset the difference between pledges and operating expenses. The Vision 175 campaign will enable significant, critical improvements to be made to our historic church, while preserving the ability of our investments and endowments to ensure and enhance programming and outreach opportunities.

Campaign Goals

In addition to preserving our endowments the financial goal of Vision 175 is to raise \$2 million to fund key improvements throughout the building. Examples include new accessible entrances and restrooms, improvements to the sanctuary, and critical safety and security upgrades in the basement children's classrooms – along with a wide range of other projects.

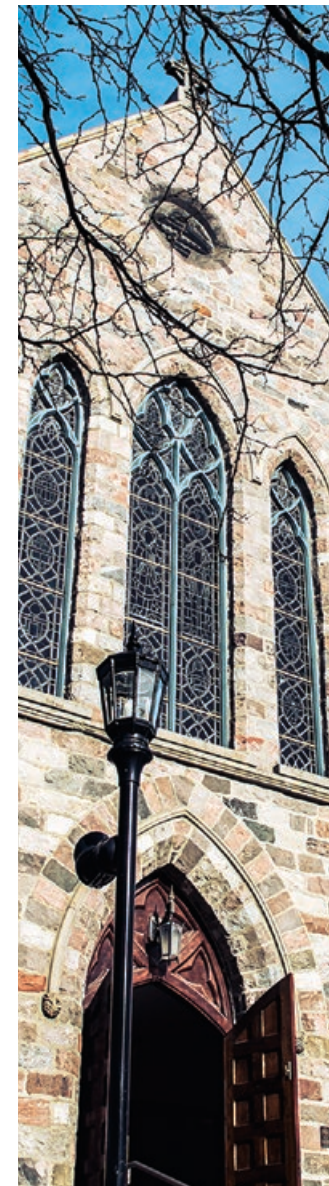

a note about color

PDFs are great tools for speeding the review-and-approval cycle. Unfortunately they can exhibit some weird behaviors — such as inaccurate reproduction of colors. You may notice some color variation between this PDF, its printout on your printer, and the final printing. Or you may not — the price we pay for convenience.

We would caution that you not use this PDF for final color approval. We suggest instead some options, depending on your need for critical color matching:

- A color laserproof, printed on our high-quality printer, directly from the source file.

- For large areas of a single color, a Pantone Matching System (PMS) color chip.

- Review the printer's matchprint.

- For truly critical color, you can even join us for the press check.

If this sounds like a disclaimer, that's because it is. When critical final color balance is important, PDFs are not the best way to accomplish this objective. Thanks.
